An update on the KY Board of Dentistry...

Just some info about our Board of Dentistry. As the Kentucky Public Information Officer for AGD, I have been going to the meetings for some time. There are some changes which will affect all dentists in the state coming this year.

Starting in 2015 we will be asked to record our CE hours online with the Board. This system is not functional yet, but will be in the next few weeks. If you do not have a computer or don't wish to use one for recording your hours, it is my understanding that you can request a paper form to be in compliance. The reported reason for the change is to save money by not doing audits as the new computer system will show non-compliance. Fines will be issued automatically and drastically increase every two weeks. This system will also affect hygienists next year.

Our state AGD chapter is working with a computer group to have all of our sponsored classes automatically entered to the Kentucky Board.

The KY Board is electing 2 new officers for the coming term Please take the time to vote. Last year only 102 of 3000 eligible dentists voted. Voting will start later this month.

I will accept any request for info about our meetings, classes, or concerns about the KY Dental Board. I may not get the answer you want but I will do my best to get the right information.

While in college as an undergrad, Dr. Hamlin says his family dentist started talking to him about dentistry. He was interested so he pursued a career in dentistry and the rest is history.



AGD Holds Leadership Development Symposium

CHICAGO (Dec. 5, 2014)—The Academy of General Dentistry (AGD) held its 2014 Leadership Development Symposium Nov. 21 to 22, in Chicago. This symposium focused on providing leadership tools to new and up-and-coming AGD leaders, helping them to develop necessary skills such as volunteerism, professionalism, and collective effectiveness.

"It was a pleasure working with the AGD's emerging leaders and helping them understand the AGD's mission, as well as helping them to build their skills in responsibility, accountability, authority, teamwork, conflict management, written and oral communications, and ethical standards," said AGD President W. Carter Brown, DMD, FAGD.

The symposium featured presentations from industry professionals on topics such as displaying dynamic leadership, identifying leadership styles, and improving communications skills.

"The goal of the symposium was to help constituent board members learn the true meaning of leadership, identify their strengths, and build their confidence as AGD leaders," said John A. Olsen, DDS, MAGD, DICOI, AGD regional director and chairman of the Leadership Development Symposium.

AGD Foundation to Focus on Oral Cancer

CHICAGO (Oct. 6, 2014)—The Academy of General Dentistry (AGD) Foundation, the philanthropic arm of the AGD, will focus on training dentists to screen for oral cancer.

"Over the next several years, we will focus our outreach and energy on various initiatives to fight oral cancer," says Gerald J. Botko, DMD, MS, MAGD, FACD, president of the AGD Foundation Board of Directors. "We believe general dentists are the public's first line of defense against this deadly disease."

Oral cancer is particularly dangerous because it can go unnoticed in its preliminary stages. In many cases, however, dentists can identify its early signs and symptoms.

"The first step in fighting oral cancer is early detection, which includes semiannual visits to a general dentist," Dr. Botko says. "By recognizing the disease in its preliminary stages, general dentists can help increase survival rates."

Following a successful debut event during the AGD 2014 Annual Meeting & Exhibits in Detroit, the AGD Foundation says it will continue over the next several years to integrate free oral cancer screenings with oral health education for the public.

In addition to free oral cancer screenings, the AGD Foundation aims to provide AGD's 39,000 members with free or lowcost continuing education on the latest oral cancer identification techniques. The AGD Foundation also plans to work with organizations, dental companies, and others who are invested in the cause. In order to make this happen, the AGD Foundation has initiated a major fundraising effort with AGD members and outside donors.
